Therefore, I do hope you'll join us at our Spring Banquet as we celebrate the lives reclaimed through God's unfailing love, and because of your unwavering compassion.



'm grateful for finding Jesus in my life, for accepting him," says Robert. "I'm really, really looking forward to having a better life, a more joyful life."

Robert was born in the Philippines. "I've been from a broken family since the age of seven," he explains. His mother died when he was seven years old, and his stepfather was physically abusive.

Following his mother's death, Robert's grandmother took him and his two older brothers in. Not long after she assumed guardianship, however, Robert's grandmother immigrated to Canada without him. His older brothers went to college. "I kind of had it rough, because I had an uncle who was an alcoholic. ... And I was teased a lot, because I was an adopted child."

"No more turning back."

Robert spent much of his childhood feeling alone, like an outsider. When he was 16, his grandmother sponsored him to join her in Canada. His older brothers didn't qualify because they were too old. "It was kind of tough, just me being approved. I didn't really want to come," he says. "I was kind of hurt by it. So when I got here, I did things on my own—didn't really follow any rules."

Upon Robert's arrival in Canada, his grandmother left him again, this time to help out her daughter in the U.S. "Then I was on my own again," Robert explains. "So I got into trouble, started drinking, doing drugs, quit school, turned the other way around, for the bad."

Robert's addictions progressed. Then he became addicted to gambling. "That's when things got worse," he says. "Gambling—it's a bad addiction." He joined the Breakout Recovery Community at that time, which was five years ago. "I completed the program, but I never really worked the steps." Consequently, once he left the community, he went back to his old ways and his old addictions.

Eventually, Robert became so miserable that he began praying, saying, "I've had enough. I can't live like this." He contemplated taking his own life.

The Breakout Recovery Community is a year-long, 12 step addiction recovery program for men. The goal of the program is to provide men with supportive community, structure and accountability to help them make positive changes in their lives. Men are admitted to the program on a continual basis and are provided with counseling, access to recreation and transitional housing.

That's when he entered Breakout for the second time.

"When I joined five years ago, I didn't really accept Jesus into my life. But now I've accepted him." Robert remembers the exact day that it happened: "Last year, April 23rd. ... It was the most amazing feeling. The spirit was in me. I just can't explain it. The burdens that were so heavy in my heart just disappeared."

Robert has been sober for almost a year now. He admits that it hasn't been easy, but he's been committed to recovering: "No more turning back."

Robert praises the Breakout Recovery program with helping him to understand and learn about himself. "I was selfish," he states. "My addiction was just a fix to make me happy."

Today, in addition to the hope and freedom he experiences in Christ, Robert feels like a new man

with new attributes. "I learned how to be humble," he says. "I like to help others more, instead of just thinking about myself. ... I'm happier now. I pray more."

Robert will graduate from Breakout soon, but he's not in a rush to leave the program this time, unlike five years ago. He will take his time, and he's even contemplating working at Hope Mission for a while. "I got my supports here, the community, case manager, pastor. And I'm going to church more now." He stays busy reading the Bible in his spare time, along with his new hobby: learning to play the bass guitar.

His long-term goal, once he's saved up enough money, is to return to the Philippines. He'd like to build a house there and reunite with his family.

Robert's gratitude list is long. "I'm grateful to the Hope Mission," he says. "I'm grateful for the community, the Breakout members and leaders. They're actually there to help you. You really gotta work the program. You really gotta want it."

Robert pauses. "And this is what I want. I need Jesus. I put Him first now."

icole is redeemed. Having graduated from the Wellspring Recovery Community in 2015, Nicole was among our honoured guests at last year's Annual Spring Banquet.

Nicole lost everything because of her addiction. She and her husband slept in stairwells of apartment buildings, and Nicole landed in jail before coming to Hope Mission.

She describes how much her life has changed.

"Wellspring [Recovery Community] has given me tools to see who God wants me to be. I'm able to be happier and make decisions that are in line with God's will for me," says Nicole.

She points to the community of Wellspring as one of the most amazing parts of her journey of recovery. She says that in the world of addiction and living on the streets, the idea of having a friendship

with a woman is "outrageous." But coming into the Wellspring community where women live, learn and journey together, the bonds of friendship and sisterhood form quickly and tightly.

"God wants us to be together as a community," says Nicole. "We're generations. We're a family. We're very much a big family."

With that come support, love and understanding. And in times when things are difficult, Nicole knows where her strength comes from.

"Every time things get rocky or things get worrisome all I [have to] do is fix my eyes on Jesus and He calms the storm," says Nicole.

"Even if the storm is still going on, He calms the storm between him and I. The storm can twist and rage all it wants, but when Jesus is there and my eyes are on Him, everything's ok."
