## Because of You



After a life of crime, drugs, and alcohol, Cameron had hit rock bottom. Years in and out of prison had left him spiralling out of control, and Cameron had no hope for the future.

In his time of greatest need, Cameron found the Herb Jamieson Centre.

"I walked through the doors of the Herb Jamieson Centre, got down on my knees, and begged for help. And with open arms they welcomed me into the program. That was the last day I ever had a drink or did any drugs. I was free."

Over the past two years, Cameron found his way back to the

very place that saved his life. In February 2020, construction began to rebuild the Herb Jamieson Centre — and Cameron was a key member of the construction crew working on the rebuild.

A few weeks before the Herb Jamieson Centre officially opened, Cameron walked through the completed shelter and was amazed. And on October 1, 2021, the rebuilt Herb Jamieson opened to the Edmonton community, to give people like Cameron hope.

Because of people like you, Cameron has much to celebrate and be thankful for. Thank you for your important role in bringing hope to people like Cameron.





Val never had much of a childhood. Growing up in an abusive home, she had to mature very quickly in order to take care of her siblings.

After already experiencing so much abandonment in the first nine years of her life, one day Val came home and found out from a social worker that her mom had left her. Val's heart was broken as she thought, "My mom doesn't want me. Nobody wants me."

Val felt alone and abandoned. She wanted so badly to be accepted by someone — anyone. This led her down a long and

dark journey of addiction, criminal activity, and living on the streets of Edmonton. Eventually she wound up in jail.

In her lowest of lows, Val had a realization that there is still hope. After hearing about Hope Mission's Wellspring Program, she knew that there was a place where she could finally find life-changing hope.

And that's exactly what happened. Val recently graduated from Wellspring and her life has completely transformed — all because of the support from amazing people like you. You saved her life.





Beth had no idea how she and her family would make it after losing her job in the midst of the pandemic. "It was really, really scary. I've never been in a position before where it was like, 'Do I pay my bills or do I feed my kids? Do I pay rent? It was so emotional and I didn't know whether we were coming or going."

The first time we heard about Beth's family struggling, our hearts broke. She was doing her best to support and feed her five children — but she just couldn't make ends meet. But generous people like you gave her hope this year.

Because of you, we have been able to support Beth and her children with regular food hampers — thank you!

The first time we showed up with a hamper, she couldn't stop crying. The hamper couldn't have come at a better time. Overwhelmed with gratitude, she told us that she was so worried that she would lose her house — but the hamper meant that she was able to pay for her bills that month.

"If it wasn't for your help, I don't know where we would be today. There were times where my cupboards were empty and we didn't know how we were going to make it — and then the food hampers came and we could eat. It was a lifesaver."

Things are still tight for Beth and her family, but thanks to caring people like you, her and her children have been able to get through this incredibly difficult year with hope in their hearts and food in their bellies. Thank you for making this possible!

Year's ago, Mouraine got involved in Rap Club and discovered



Because of your generous donations, you gave youth like Mouraine a place to belong and feel safe. Thank you for helping to make a way for youth to succeed and flourish in our community.


