Hope Mission exists to serve, strengthen and uplift men, women, youth and children through the life-changing gospel of Jesus Christ.


Thank you!

DUSTIN'S STORY

Surprised by hope

Dustin remembers what it was like to be stuck in addiction.

"It was a life of despair. I knew I needed to stop doing drugs because they were destroying my life, but I didn't even really believe that was possible. And I knew something had to change."

Dustin enrolled in Breakout, Hope Mission's year-long recovery program for men. And he noticed a change in himself he never thought was possible.

"What I had been doing for 15 years I didn't want to do anymore. I actually had real joy in my life. It was a transformation I couldn't believe happened. I'm a completely different person than I used to be."

Dustin is grateful for the community he's built through Breakout and his local church.

"These are people I care about, they care about me, and our relationship isn't based on drugs."

After he completes the program, Dustin is eager to get back to work and make the most of the rest of his life.

"God has a plan for me. I feel like I have a future now."

KATHLEEN'S STORY

Support for a grieving family

Kathleen and her family came to a community dinner at Hope Mission, grieving the loss of her baby three weeks earlier.

"By the time I went to go get induced, it was too late to save her," says Kathleen.

With three other children at home, Kathleen was grateful to receive frozen meals and food hampers from Hope Mission.

"They're really helpful. I don't think I would get through it if it wasn't for everyone here."

Kathleen's kids love going to the after-school programs at Hope Mission, where they're making friends and gaining confidence. And with a budget that's getting even tighter due to high inflation, rising rent and increasing grocery prices, Kathleen appreciates the food supports.

"That really helps – the lasagnas and stuff. Then we don't have to struggle to make ends meet. I don't know what single moms would do without programs like this."

KALI'S STORY

The power of encouragement

For as long as she can remember, Kali felt like something was wrong with her - like there was an empty void she couldn't fill.

"I never gave myself an honest try at anything. I just got lost in the alcoholism for the most part."

Kali tried to get sober, but relapsed shortly after. Her relapse was her rock bottom: she engaged in toxic relationships, tried harder drugs, and ended up homeless, sleeping on the streets.

"I was totally alone. I was scared for my life. And I got on my knees, praying to God."

At Kali's lowest moment, your kindness stepped in to give the gift of recovery. Kali found Wellspring, Hope Mission's year-long recovery program for women.

"I was very scared, very timid, and I didn't trust anybody, but I knew I was there for a reason."

At Wellspring, Kali is recovering. Thanks to your generosity, she has a roof over her head, nutritious meals every day, and continued encouragement from staff and people like you. In fact, Kali keeps notes that people like you write.

"Being recognized, in a good way. It's nice to know that people do remember you, that people do care. It means more than you'd ever believe."

Lucas, 13, has been coming to the Tegler Youth Centre since he was seven. He enjoys the delicious meals and the rock climbing wall during the after-school programs.


